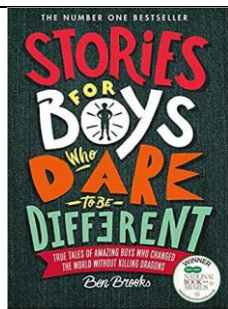

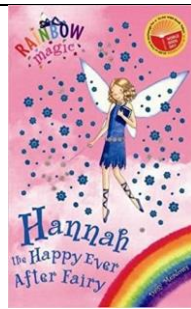

Our children have been developing a wonderful reading repertoire! Here are just a few of the books that have really grabbed them.



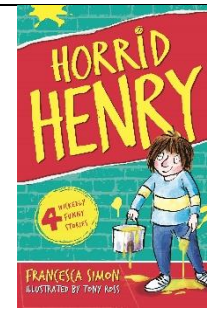

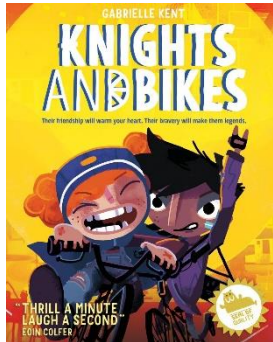


'The Grotlyn' by Benji Davies

Recommended for Reception, Years 1 and 2

Mysterious things are happening in town, with many of the townsfolk experiencing things going missing - which even the police officer can't explain!

Written in verse, The Grotlyn serves as a beautiful bedtime read to be enjoyed together; I found myself becoming immersed in the illustrations as the story progressed.



'Knights and Bikes' by Gabrielle Kent

Recommended for Years 3 and 4

Set on the sleepy island of Penfurzy, Demelza and her loyal goose sidekick meet Nessa, a super cool teenager who appears to be on the run. Together, they set out on an adventure to discover the source of the mysterious goings-on on the island.

Knights and Bikes is fast-paced and full of laughs. There are also some 80's gaming references for any parents who were keen gamers in their youth! With illustrations by Rex Crowle perfectly placed throughout the book, Knights and Bikes appeals to the tricky 7-9 years of age market. I believe this to be a perfect chapter book for those confident readers, or one to enjoy together as a family! There's also a video game of the book.



'The Last Chance Hotel' by Nicki Thornton

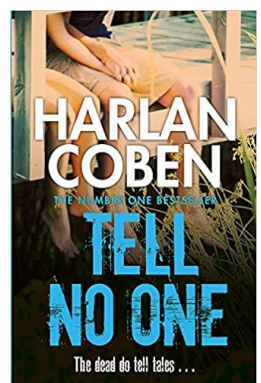
Recommended for Years 5 and 6

This is a book about a kitchen boy called Seth. His father has long left, leaving him imprisoned until he is old enough to set out on his own. If there's any hope he has, it's to be the greatest chef that ever lived... just like his father. Unfortunately, he works for the worse people ever – Mr and Mrs Bunn. And even worse is their evil daughter, Tiffany.

One night, a band of magicians begin to arrive to participate in a secret meeting to determine the most talented magicians in the world, judged by their leader Dr Thallonius. Seth has one task: to make Dr Thallonius the greatest dessert he's ever tasted. Then, maybe he will help Seth find a way to freedom.

But when the doors to the private meeting open, and Dr Thallonius is lying dead on the floor, the group blames the dessert, which means that it's Seth who will pay the price. But Seth knows he's innocent, and only has so much time to eliminate each suspect and prove his innocence.

This is a fantastic mix of Harry Potter meeting any murder mystery classic.



'Tell No One' by Harlan Coben

Recommended for grown-ups!

Having recently 'binge-watched' the various Netflix series based on Harlan Coben's books, my reading list has been somewhat hijacked by his gripping thrillers! This, I think, is one of his most enthralling... Eight years ago, David Beck's wife died in an attack that left him knocked unconscious. But a mysterious message in his inbox tells him to log on to a website at a specific time and he sees an image of his dead wife. It leads to a fantastic story as David tries to find out what really happened the night his wife died...
